Aesthetics is the philosophical study of art. In its original Greek derivation, the term denoted the study of sense experience generally and it was not until the mid-18th century, following a usage introduced by Baumgarten, that a particular reference to the idea of beauty in nature and art was established.

Born of philosophical modernity, aesthetics remains a philosophical discipline that despite its attempts has not been emancipated in the science of art. It is only by simplification that we agree that aesthetics (philosophy of the senses and art) is a reflection on art, because the object of this
