Nonverbal Cues: A teacher can use subtle body movements (like proximity) or more explicit hand signals to cue self-regulation. One popular cue involves moving to the front of the room and making eye contact with the high schooler who is acting out, then pausing until you have the individual's attention.

Strategies to manage or change behaviour in schools can involve school-wide, classroom- based or

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individual child-focused interventions: the focus of this paper is on classroom-based interventions derived from Applied Behaviour Analysis (ABA), which involves the application of the principles of operant conditioning (Skinner, 1953) to socially relevant human behaviours (Baer, Wolf & Risley, 1968).
