What are mucinoses? Mucinoses are a diverse group of uncommon skin disorders. All involve accumulation in the skin of abnormal amounts of mucin.This is a jelly-like complex carbohydrate substance, called hyaluronic acid, that occurs normally as part of the connective tissue in the dermis or mid-layer of the skin. The abnormal deposits that occur in mucinoses can be localised or widespread.

Acute dermatitis presents as red, swollen and blistered plaques. Chronic dermatitis accompanied by rubbing and scratching results in darkened (hyperpigmented), and thickened (lichenified) plaques.

### Skin Complications | ADA

Leukocytoclastic vasculitis (cutaneous small vessel vasculitis) associated with circulating type II cryoglobulins, usually yields palpable purpura on the lower extremities. Treatment of the hepatitis C infection often leads to resolution of the vasculitis.

Necrobiosis lipoidica diabetorum (NLD) is caused by changes in the blood vessels and generally affects the lower legs. With NLD, the affected skin becomes raised, yellow, and waxy in appearance, often with a bluish-purple border. Sometimes, NLD is itchy and painful. As long as the sores do not break open, treatment is not necessary.

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
