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International Carriage Of Goods By

The CMR Convention (full title Convention on the Contract for the International Carriage of Goods by Road) is a United Nations convention that was signed in Geneva on 19 May 1956. It relates to various legal issues concerning transportation of cargo by road. It has been ratified by the majority of European states. As of September 2019, it has been ratified by 45 states.

International law is part of national law and must be ascertained and administered by the courts of justice of appropriate jurisdiction. In order to avoid the extensive nationalisation of carriage laws there was need to draft and rectify treaties and conventions that would regulate carriage of goods internationally.
