The II-V-I is one of the most used chord progressions in jazz standards, so it is an important progression for jazz players to learn. The II-V-I are roman numerals for 2-5-1 and so the chords are built of the second, fifth and first degree of the major scale.

The simple explanation is that in Jazz the VI chord in a I > VI > ii > V progression is often made dominant. Not always, but it’s extremely common. It just sounds good, and the only rule in music is that it has to sound good to somebody. The more complex answer is that the VI dominant 7th chord is the secondary
