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Pterygium Surgery

Pterygium surgery is a procedure performed to remove noncancerous conjunctiva growths (pterygia) from the eye. The conjunctiva is the clear tissue covering the white part of the eye and the inside of the eyelids. Some cases of a pterygium produce little to no symptoms.

Pterygium removal surgery eliminates the abnormal tissue from the cornea and sclera (white of the eye). The older, standard surgical technique left a bare hole in the conjunctiva (the surface of the eye) where the pterygium was removed. Unfortunately, this led to a high rate of pterygium regrowth.

Pterygium Surgery What is a pterygium? A pterygium (pronounced te-ri-gi-um) is a triangular shaped lump of tissue, which grows from the conjunctiva (the thin membrane that covers the white of the eye) onto the cornea (clear central part of the eye). A pterygium can occur in both eyes, usually on the nasal side of the eye.

Pterygium surgery requires that the lesion is removed from the surface of the eye. Then, a small piece of skin is taken from beneath the eyelid to fill in the area where the pterygium was removed. Using a self-transplant also helps in preventing the occurrence of pterygium.
