Sociologist Colin Bell, then-convenor of the Scottish Consortium on Crime and Criminal Justice (SCCCJ), commented in the Consortiums Report on Drugs and Crime that drug abuse is ^above all, a deeply entrenched social problem with serious consequences for public health and justice. Indeed, drug misuse is estimated to have a total economic and social cost to Scotland of £3.5 billion a year.

Violence, Drugs and Alcohol Violence is a form of crime which is often, but not necessarily, related to drugs and alcohol misuse. The Uniform Crime Reporting Program (UCR) of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) reported that in 2007, 3.9% of the 14,831 homicides in which circumstances were known were narcotics related. Murders that occurred specifically during a narcotics felony, such as drug trafficking or manufacturing, are considered drug related.

Drugs are related to crime in multiple ways. Most directly, it is a crime to use, possess, manufacture, or distribute drugs classified as having a potential for abuse. Cocaine, heroin, marijuana, and amphetamines are examples of drugs classified to have abuse potential.
