Sepsis is a clinical syndrome of life-threatening organ dysfunction caused by a dysregulated response to infection. In septic shock, there is critical reduction in tissue perfusion; acute failure of multiple organs, including the lungs, kidneys, and liver, can occur.Common causes in immunocompetent patients include many different species of gram-positive and gram-negative bacteria.

Over the years, we have learned from our visits to hospitals that a major contributing factor for the CNM deaths in Haiti is a major shortage of neonatal, pediatric, and adult intensive care units. Probably no other observation underscores the poor condition of the Haiti health care system than the dire shortage of neonatal intensive care units.
