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### Non Opioid Otc Analgesics Risks

Side effects include gastrointestinal ulcers and bleeding, increased risk of heart attacks, and renal function impairment. The severity of these side effects is often underestimated because most non-opioid analgesics are easily available OTC.

### Non-Opioid Analgesics Role in Pain Management - NEJM ...

How they're taken: Most non-opioids are taken by mouth. Some are given by injection or IV before, during, or after a surgical procedure. Possible side effects include: kidney problems; liver problems; nausea; vomiting; constipation; numbness and tingling in mouth or lips; lightheadedness; anxiety; abnormal heart rate; bleeding and bruising problems (NSAIDs only)

### Non-Narcotic Analgesics (Non-Opioids)

### Report: Over-the-counter analgesics can help manage acute pain

Acetaminophen is one of the most commonly used nonopioid analgesics that is available in a variety of OTC and prescription products. Nonselective and selective (ie, celecoxib) NSAIDs are also common nonopioid analgesics that produce dose-dependent effects with the potential for serious GI and cardiovascular events.

Slow heartbeat. Withdrawal symptoms may occur when people who have been taking narcotic analgesics abruptly stop taking them. Symptoms are like having the flu, and may include body aches, chills, depression, diarrhea, goose-bumps, headaches, high blood pressure, insomnia, irritability, a runny nose and sweats.

Non-opioid agents differ from opioid analgesics in several ways: non-opioids have a ceiling effect in analgesia (a maximum dose beyond which analgesic effect does not increase) do not produce tolerance, physical dependence, or euphoria, and are not associated with abuse or addiction

### Differences between Opioid and Non-opioid Analgesics

Opioids should not be the first-line or routine therapy for chronic pain as they present serious risks, including overdose and opioid use disorder. Guideline for Prescribing Opioids for Chronic Pain If prescribing opioids, combine this treatment with nonopioid medication and nonpharmacologic treatment, as appropriate.

### Module 2: Treating Chronic Pain without Opioids

Benefits and risks. Side effects of these medications are generally mild, but may include nausea, dizziness or drowsiness. As a group, antidepressants and anti-seizure medications may, rarely, worsen depression or cause suicidal thoughts.

### Chronic pain: Medication decisions - Mayo Clinic

Both narcotic and non-narcotic pain relievers can pose health risks if misused or taken in conjunction with other substances. Acetaminophen is the most widely used non-narcotic pain reliever but can lead to overdose and liver damage if taken in excess.

### Risks of Habit-Forming Analgesics - Opiates

Can irritate the stomach. Can cause bleeding of the stomach lining, especially if combined with alcohol or if you smoke. Can cause kidney problems. Avoid these drugs if you are on anti-cancer drugs that may cause bleeding, or if you are taking blood thinners, steroids, blood pressure medicines, or lithium.

Anyone who takes prescription opioids can become addicted to them. In fact, as many as one in four patients receiving long-term opioid therapy in a primary care setting struggles with opioid addiction. 4.5.6 Once addicted, it can be hard to stop. In 2016, more than 11.5 million Americans reported misusing prescription opioids in the past year. 1

Every year, millions of prescriptions are written for pain medications — many of them powerful opioids that can cause side effects and lead to addiction.

### Non-Opioid Treatment for Chronic Pain - When Seconds Count

Narcotic analgesics and narcotic analgesic combinations have been associated with some serious risks such as respiratory depression (unusually slow and shallow breathing), opioid-use disorder, and potentially fatal overdose. They are potentially addictive and should only be used for certain conditions and under strict monitoring.
