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MR images were evaluated independently by two radiologists. Six-week follow-up radiographs were used as a standard to diagnose fractures.

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RESULTS: MR imaging depicted occult fractures of the scaphoid bone in 14 patients (33%), the capitate bone in four (10%), the trapezium in one (2%), and the distal radius in two (5%).
