The present perfect simple can be used (often with 'since' and 'for') to talk about unfinished actions that started in the past and are still true in the present.

Present Perfect Simple or Present Perfect Continuous Tense?

The present perfect form in itself doesn't suggest an unfinished action, but knowing that people tend to grow (at least until a certain age), often these sentences would suggest an unfinished action. In 3, and in general when we talk about how long something has been happening, we generally use a continuous form: 'She's been living with us since last week'.

Forming the Present Perfect. The present perfect of any verb is composed of two elements : the appropriate form of the auxiliary verb to have (present tense), plus the past participle of the main verb. The past participle of a regular verb is base+ed, e.g. played, arrived, looked.

We use present perfect, and not present simple for actions or situations that started in the past and are still true now. We' ve been friends since first grade. (NOT We are friends since first grade.) We don't use the word ago with the present perfect. They' ve been married for 10 years. (NOT They are married since 10 years ago.)
