Should is often used in conditional clauses expressing possibilities, suppositions etc. By using should in the if-clause we are suggesting that something is unlikely or not particularly probable.. If you should run into Mathews, tell him that he owes me \$100. (= Your chances of meeting Mathews

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are rather slim, but if you MEET him, tell him that he owes me some money.)
